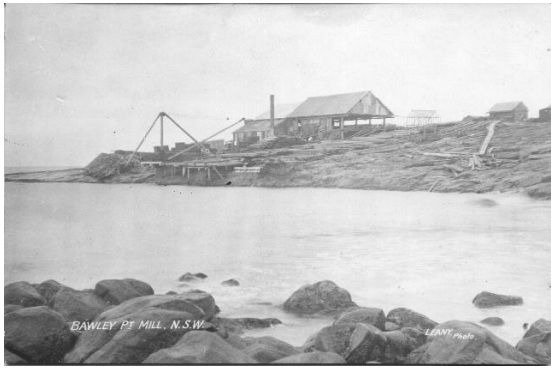

Pay at the door - \$10 includes the ‘conversation’, a sausage sizzle, tea/coffee soft drinks. Seats are limited.

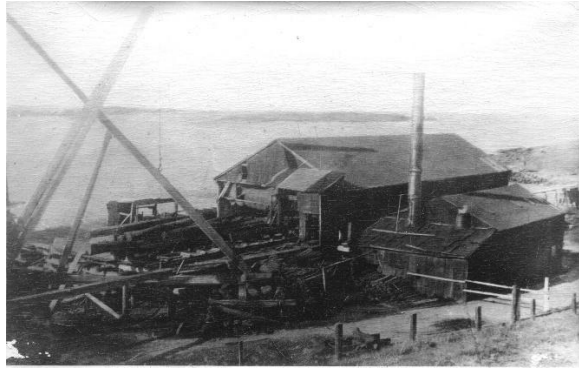
